
took on the challenge fundraising goals and internal competitions between departments. As we build a culture of

Clinical Pastoral Education Program, Extending the Healing Ministry for 35 Years

s a faith-based organization, CHRISTUS ASanta Rosa Health System believes in attending to the whole person by providing physical, mental, and spiritual care for our patients.

The Clinical Pastoral Education Program (CPE) provides professional education to residents who wish to become certified chaplains or to seminary students who seek a unit of CPE to enhance the ministerial dimension of their theological degrees.

Throughout the program, residents learn necessary communication skills, receive interpersonal formation, and integrate their pastoral identity and professional functioning, while interacting closely with patients and families.

"Having CPE Residents allows CHRISTUS Santa Rosa to provide ministry to more patients, families, Associates, and physicians across our facilities and in varied services lines," said Mary Davis, regional director of spiritual care and director of CPE. "Many patients enjoy receiving ministry from persons studying clinical ministry, and the residents are humbled to be received so openly by persons in need."

"Our focus is tending to the spiritual needs of our patients in order to improve their quality of life. It is a vocation, not just a job," said Jeremy Miller, current CPE resident.

In 2015, the Friends of CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Foundation provided funding for the CPE program to establish a permanent classroom, allowing classes to become more accessible and convenient. Each resident now has individual desk space and access to a library of resources.

With 399 graduates to date, this accredited

Graduate Medical Education program is preparing to celebrate its 35th anniversary in October. The anniversary celebration will honor program alumni by recognizing their various accomplishments. Graduates of the program have gone on to serve in health, education, community, and church ministries throughout the United States and numerous countries.

"The CPE program is not only beneficial for CHRISTUS Santa Rosa, but it benefits the San Antonio community by training chaplains who will extend their healing ministry throughout San Antonio and beyond," said Dennis P. Gonzales, Ph.D., regional vice president of mission integration for CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Health System. "As the health care industry grows, it becomes more difficult to find the resources to grow vital programs such as the CPE program. Any additional support to the program would be a blessing and would provide an avenue for the program to continue to be successful for another 35 years."



The 19-bed unit provides short-term inpatient services to seniors ages 65 and older who are experiencing mental health crises and require psychiatric treatment.



Westover Hills

Secondary Cardiac Catheterization Lab Improves Quality Care

In 2011, the Friends Foundation donated its largest gift to date of \$1 million to fund the expansion of the Cardiac Catheterization (Cath) Lab at CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Hospital -Westover Hills (CSRH - WH). This gift provided a second procedure suite which made it possible to better serve the community by allowing more patients to receive the best guality of care. The Cath Lab has since continued to grow, bringing the first open heart and cardiovascular programs to the Westover Hills community. Since 2013, the lab has seen an increase of 28% in patient volume and is able to see 25 – 30 patients per week.

According to Kenneth Perry, director of cardiology services at CSRH - WH, the new room has greatly improved the patient experience and satisfaction level.

"The donation we received from the Friends Foundation has allowed us to grow tremendously, which has helped us attract outstanding physicians to our program. We now have eight cardiologists working in the lab on a regular basis," said Perry. "We are very grateful for the generosity of the donors who made it possible for us to better care for our patients."


